Course Overview:

Are you part of the revival of interest in handcrafts and DIY? Join us as we learn to knit and crochet in just one year! These classic handcrafts aren't just for grandma; with the resurgence of diy comes modern stylish patterns and an amazing variety of quality yarns. I am excited to share my passion for these crafts with both boys and girls, as well as adults who would like to learn or refresh their skills. Students will need to purchase a learn to crochet kit and a learn to knit kit, as well as yarn for projects throughout the year.

Fall Semester: Learn to Crochet! Learn about yarn, crochet hook basics, gauge, common stitches, and reading a pattern and/or chart. Projects will begin with dish cloths, potholders, and granny squares and progress based on interest and skill level of the class. Students should finish the semester as established beginners.

Spring Semester: Learn to Knit! Review yarn and gauge, and learn about knitting needle basics, common stitches, and reading a pattern and/or chart. Projects will begin with dish cloths and scarves and progress based on interest and skill level of the class. Students should finish the semester as established beginners.

Experienced Students: Students who already have experience with knit and/or crochet will continue to establish skills and learn advanced techniques in knit and crochet. They will choose intermediate and/or advanced patterns to be completed with tutor guidance.



Tuition: \$235 for the year

\$35 non-refundable deposit due at registration; \$100 due September 9, 2024; \$100 due January 20, 2025. If the class is dropped after the third class of the semester, tuition is not refunded.

Materials: Students will need to purchase a learn to crochet kit, a learn to knit kit, and yarn for projects throughout the year.
