

Write On! Writing Essays the Right Way **at KAT**

An in-depth course on writing a variety of essays

For whom?

High school students who need solid instruction on how to write a variety of essays.

What is it?

This course will explore many major types of essays, including: narrative (tells a story), descriptive (describes something/someone), comparison/contrast (compares and contrasts two items, ideas, or people), argumentative research (with the goal to sway the reader to accept the writer's point of view), traditional research paper (exploring both MLA and APA formats), and timed writing (writing a response with only a certain amount of time to complete, which will be great preparation for college entrance exams as well as college courses). Kristen will take students through the entire writing process, focusing specifically on the type of essay at hand. Students will learn how to brainstorm, find research, take notes in an organized fashion, write an outline, edit one's own work, edit other people's work, and complete a final draft.

Kristen has hired a former student who has an English degree from Liberty University to help her with the crux of editing papers on the initial turn-in. He is one of Kristen's most accomplished former writing students and has lots of professional editing experience. She has trained him to edit as she does and feels confident in his skills. Kristen will always look over the papers and do all of the redo grading herself.

How will this help my youngster?

Since Kristen has taught in the public school system and maintains close relationships with many current public and private school teachers, she knows the current standards, curriculum, and material that students of this age need to know and understand to successfully move onto the high school grades and then to college. Since she has taught a writing class at KAT since 2006, she recognizes the areas where she needs to focus her teaching for this home school program.

As students progress through high school and toward college, they need to know how to write concise, thoughtful essays that are structured appropriately. This class will offer the tools necessary to become successful writers in college and beyond!

How much is this going to cost me?

\$450 per student for the entire year:

- \$50 deposit is due at registration to secure a spot in the class
- \$175 is due on or before the first day of class in September
- \$225 is due at the beginning of the second semester in January

Length

This class is a one year program, following the KAT's schedule.

Materials

Students will need paper and writing utensils. Home computers are appropriate, but not required, for out of class work.

Drop Policy

If a student needs to drop class (within the first four classes), tuition will be refunded on a pro-rated basis for the number of classes we have left, less a small amount for the church building fee. **NO refund will be given after class four.**

Absence/Cancellation Policy

If a student misses class, it is his/her responsibility to see Kristen for make-up work and class material.
